



Are you a fire department looking for a grant to purchase StoveTop FireStop®? We want to help.

What is the primary goal of the Fire Prevention and Safety grant?

The primary goal of the FP&S grant is to reach high-risk target groups in order to mitigate the high incidences of death and injuries.

Who can apply?

National, regional, state, local, and community organizations (including fire departments) recognized for their experience and expertise in fire prevention and safety programs can apply. The organizations include private and public non-profits.

When can I apply?

The application process for FP&S grants typically occurs in September. However, September is when you **must** submit the completed application. You will want to collect information, write the narrative, and compile documentation months in advance.

How do I start?

Prior to applying, the most important document you need is the Program Guidance document on the FEMA website, available at <http://www.firegrantsupport.com>. If the website does not yet list the current year's guide, refer to the previous year's guide for basic information.

Continue to check the site for the new Program Guidance document because rules and regulations may change slightly from year to year. Also consult the application process tutorial.

What do I include in the narrative?

In the narrative, include a description of your organization's financial need and the cost of the items that make up your request. The narrative is your opportunity to persuade a grant-reviewing committee of the benefits of your project. As you write, remember: the primary goal of the FP&S grant is to mitigate the high incidences of death and injuries in high-risk target groups.

The narrative is a thorough description of the planned project, along with the benefits the community and/or organization would receive. How do I increase my chances of receiving a grant?

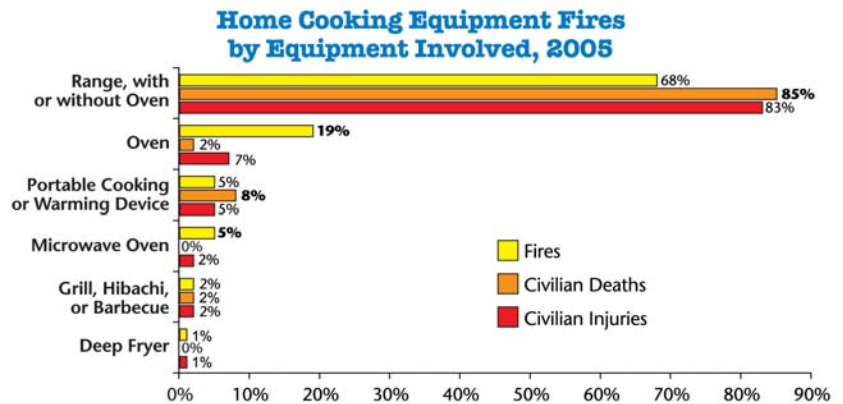
Completely read the Program Guidance document. Keep in mind: the grant reviewing committee looks for compliance to the rules listed in the Program Guidance document. They encourage innovative projects that meet the needs of your target group. Remember to explain why you need the grant, provide documentation, and follow all other instructions.
