StoveTop FireStop Plays a Role in Unique Cooking Fire Safety Demonstrations

The Saint Paul, Minnesota, Fire Department Plans to Showcase FireStop in a Traveling Fire Education and Suppression Program

Fort Worth, TX, December 2, 2009—StoveTop FireStop is making the rounds with the Saint Paul, Minnesota, Fire Department to demonstrate the tenets of cooking fire safety—in the back of a trailer. For the demonstrations, the manufacturer of StoveTop FireStop, Williams-Pyro, Inc., donated twenty-four StoveTop FireStop units. “We [the fire department] plan to use the units as part of our cooking fire demonstration program, where we show people the dangers of grease fires and how to safely extinguish them,” says Saint Paul Fire Chief, Timothy M. Butler.

The fire department performed a demonstration during the Minnesota State Fire Chiefs’ Conference on October 15-17. In only a few months, they have presented to over 1,500 people. Soon, they will incorporate StoveTop FireStop into their new demonstration trailer.

The trailer (pictured left) allows them to simulate a cooking fire and recommend proper fire suppression techniques. Saint Paul Fire Investigator, Jamie Novak, has been “talking up the StoveTop FireStop” as a first line of defense against stovetop fires. And for *Project Safe Haven*, a self-inspection program for Saint Paul homeowners, the Saint Paul Fire Department Public

Information Officer, Paula Peterson, facilitated a grant purchase of one hundred pairs of StoveTop FireStop.

About the size of a tuna can, StoveTop FireStop (right) easily and discreetly attaches to the underside of the kitchen venthood via a magnet. Should a grease fire occur, and flames touch the bottom of the device, StoveTop FireStop pops open to release harmless, non-toxic, fire-suppressing powder onto the fire.
